Use the test results with information from your child's school

You can use other information to help you judge the level your child is working at. For example, you may be able to get information from their class teacher about their areas of weakness and how well they're predicted to do in their maths SAT. This will give you an idea of whether your child would thrive in a selective school. These schools are often highly competitive and a child who passes the 11+ can still find themselves at the bottom of the class, struggling to keep up.
